Carroll County, MD—Carroll County Recreation & Parks, The Partnership for a Heathier Carroll County, Inc, and Carroll County Public Library have partnered to create a Story Stroll at Leister Park. Construction of the Story Stroll stations was done by Tim Beavers and the Carroll County Homeschool Community Center. The community is invited to help kick off the opening of the Story Stroll on Saturday, July 16 at 10am. Leister Park is located at 4134 Black Rock Road in Hampstead, MD. The rain date for this event will be Friday, July 22 at 10am.

What is a Story Stroll?

A Story Stroll is a unique way for families to combine literacy with physical activity. The pages from a children's book are mounted to panels that are placed periodically throughout the park along a trail. There are 20 stations along the trail, each featuring part of the story book. Panels also include other activities that families can do to interact with the book. The stroll takes an average family approximately 30 minutes to complete. The first installment in the Leister Park Story Stroll is *Sheep Take a Hike* written by Nancy Shaw and illustrated by Margot Apple.
