Until 1800, ice cream remained a rare and exotic dessert enjoyed mostly by the elite. Around 1800, insulated ice houses were invented. Manufacturing ice cream soon became an industry in America, pioneered in 1851 by a Baltimore milk dealer named Jacob Fussell. Like other

American industries, ice cream production increased because of technological innovations, including steam power, mechanical refrigeration, the homogenizer, electric power and motors, packing machines, and new freezing processes and equipment.

Jerome L. Day

By honoring Private Jerome L. Day we honor all American Soldiers who lost their lives in WWI.

Private Jerome L. Day served in H Company of the 29th Division, United States Army. Members of H Company, including Private Day, were assigned to the Westminster Armory and deployed from that location during World War I. Private Day was killed in action on October 8, 1918 in the Battle of Malbrouck Hill, France, becoming the first casualty of WWI from Carroll County.

Memorial Garden at Westminster City Hall

The Memorial Garden is an eligible location for the Summer Adventure. It is located on the grounds of Westminster City Hall, 1838 Emerald Hill Ln, Westminster, MD 21157.



This building was re-dedicated on October 6, 2018 in memory of Private Jerome L. Day, who served in H Company of the 29th Infantry Division, United States Army.

Completed in 1918, the Westminster Armory was built for Company H, First Maryland Infantry, composed entirely of men from Carroll County, Maryland. The unit, organized in 1899 as the Carroll County Military Company, received recognition as part of the Maryland National Guard in 1901.

Members of H Company of the 29th Division, including Private Day, were assigned to the Westminster Armory. They were deployed from this location to serve their country in France during World War I.

Private Jerome Day was killed in action during the Battle of Malbrouck Hill in France on October 8, 1918. Private Day was the first casualty from Carroll County during World War I.

The re-dedication of this building in honor of Private Day recognizes the service and sacrifice of all of our nation's veterans.

Longwell Avenue Armory Building

Longwell Avenue Armory Building is also an eligible location for the Summer Adventure. Located down the street from City Hall at 11 Longwell Ave, Westminster, MD 21157

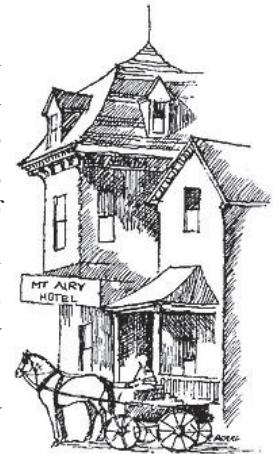

There are collections related to Mount Airy commerce, transportation, education, manufacturing, and the history of the B&O Railroad in Mount Airy. There is also a vibrant train display depicting Mount Airy around 1900.

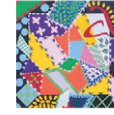

experience a part of Carroll County's rich history

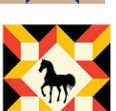
The Carroll County Barn Quilt Trail is a collaborative project undertaken by the Carroll County Arts Council, the Carroll County Office of Tourism, the Carroll County Department of Recreation and Parks, and the Carroll County Public Library. The program pays homage to Carroll's agrarian history by installing 8-foot square quilt blocks on scenic barns throughout the county. The barn quilt tradition actually dates back many years when farmers used to paint Pennsylvania Dutch hex signs and other folk art designs on their barns.



There are dozens of barn quilts located throughout Carroll County.

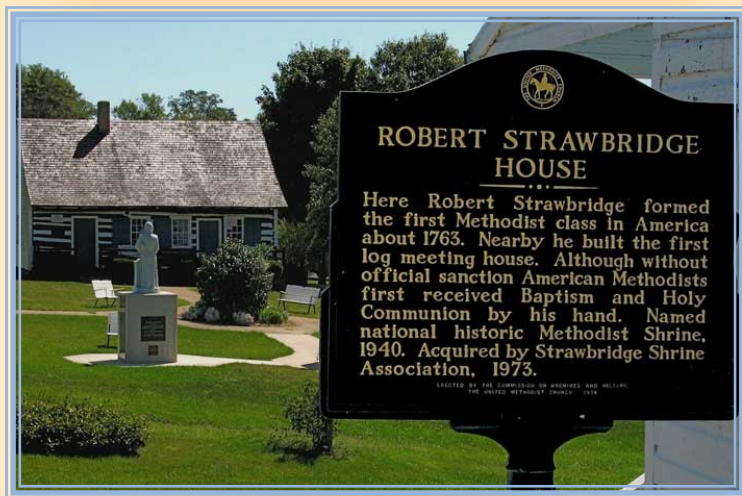

Civil War Encampment and Living History

Saturday & Sunday, July 15th—16th from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

Step back in time on the grounds of the historic Union Mills Homestead for a Civil War Living History event. Two days of special events commemorate Civil War history at the actual encampment sites used by J.E.B. Stuart's Cavalry & Sykes' Union V Corps. Living history includes military & civilian interpretations as visitors get a front-row view of Civil War military forces & the effect on civilians at the Union Mills Homestead, where both Union & Confederate forces rested before the decisive battle at Gettysburg.

Admission to the park is \$10 a car, which includes all the living history, demonstrations, presentations, & walk-through tours of the house and mill.

ELLSWORTH CEMETERY

Ellsworth Cemetery was created legally on December 21, 1876 when six Black Union Army Veterans formed the Ellsworth Cemetery Company. Mr. Reuben Walker, Mr. David Ireland, Mr. William Adams, Mr. Lewis Dorsey, Mr. William Massey and Mr. Samuel Bowen signed the articles of incorporation to provide a burial place "for the Colored residents of Westminster, Maryland."

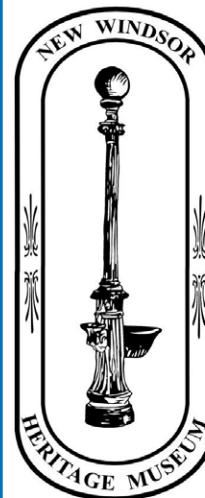

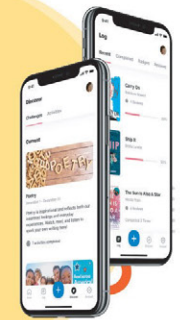
